Rosh Hashana Food Guide

For Rosh Hashana, there are many customs of eating various foods. A general guide to which foods require kosher certification can be found <u>on our website</u>. Here are some Rosh Hashana-related examples:

- 1. Fresh Fruit and Vegetables are acceptable without certification unless they are imported from Eretz Yisroel. All produce from Eretz Yisroel requires certification to ensure that all appropriate halachos were observed.
- 2. Fish: Raw fish can be purchased without certification using the criteria in <u>our fish</u> guide. This applies to whole fish, cuts or fish heads.
- 3. Honey
 - unflavored, liquid, does not require certification.
 - Flavored, requires reliable certification.
 - Non-filtered is not recommended without certification.

The following foods have infestation concerns <u>regardless of certification status</u>. For more information, see <u>our produce guide</u>.

- 1. Figs: Require inspection by turning the fig inside out and looking for noticeable webbing. If you check a few fruit in a package and there is no webbing, the rest may be used without inspection.
- 2. Dates: Whole or imported dates require inspection; Domestic pitted dates do not require inspection
- **3.** Leek: Examine the outside for any leaf miner trails. Check between the layers for thrips or other insects.
- **4. Golden Raisins:** Recent testing has shown an increased infestation issue specifically in golden raisins. As such, golden raisins should not be used, regardless of the source, even when bearing a generally accepted certification, until further notice. Currently, this concern does **not** apply to red raisins or currants.
- **5. Black Eyed Peas:** Dried Peas should first be boiled in water. After they have been fully cooked, allow the peas to soak in the water for 2-3 hours. The peas will then swell and the peel will become translucent. Then check as instructed below. (Canned or Frozen Peas may be checked straight out of the can/bag; there is no need to boil or soak.) To check all types:
 - Take the peas and inspect for holes or dark-colored stains, as this may indicate an insect beneath the thin peel.
 - If there is a dark spot on the peel, remove the thin skin and check if there is a cavity with a bug in it. NOTE: The black "eye" spot is not a sign of infestation. Similarly, orange-colored stains on the surface are not signs of infestation; only dark or black stains are of concern.

The following is a synopsis of Pas Yisroel:

Pas Yisroel only applies to items which are, a) made from wheat, barley, oats, rye or spelt **and** b) have a bread-like appearance.

- Pas Yisroel applies to items such as bread, bagels, pizza, cake, crackers, cookies, bread croutons and pies.
- Pas Yisroel does not apply to items such as rice cakes, granola bars, Cheerios® and raw pasta.

365 by Whole Foods Market: All breads and rolls with Scroll K symbol are Pas Yisroel.

Aldi's (Specially Selected® brand): All breads with Scroll K symbol are Pas Yisroel.

Asli Mediterranean Grill: Pas Yisroel options are available upon request.

Brickfire Bakery[®]: All breads and rolls with Scroll K symbol are Pas Yisroel.

Brooklyn Pizza: All products are Pas Yisroel.

East Side Kosher Deli: All products baked at, or served in, East Side Kosher Deli are Pas Yisroel. Many Pas Yisroel items are available in the supermarket section as well.

Fredrik's by Meijer™: All breads and rolls with Scroll K symbol are Pas Yisroel.

Full Circle Market™: Take & Bake breads with Scroll K symbol are Pas Yisroel.
